# **Third Sunday in Ordinary Time**

January 23, 2022

THE CHURCH: THE BODY OF CHRIST: The second reading this Sunday is the famous text from the First Letters to the Corinthians, in which St. Paul compares the Church to a human body. The Church is truly a kind of body, of which Christ is the head, and with him she forms a whole. At the same time there is a unity among the diversity and multiplicity of charisms. It is by these gifts of the Holy Spirit that the Church is able to be a rich and vital organism with a unity that welcomes a providential diversity and differences. The Church prolongs the presence of the Risen Lord throughout history through the Sacraments, the Word of God and the charisms and ministries distributed among the Christian community. It is in Christ and in the Holy Spirit that the Church is an intimate communion and holy.

As is already the case, parishioners are welcome to attend any mass and at either church.
