DEATH OF POPE EMERITUS BENEDICT XVI – 1927-2022

Please pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI.

Dear faithful of the Diocese of Pembroke, it is with both sadness and gratitude that we join all Christians and non-Christians around the world in marking the passing of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI this Saturday, December 31, 2022, at 9:34 a.m. (Rome local time) in the Mater Ecclesiae Monastery at the Vatican. Joseph Ratzinger was born on April 16, 1927, in Marktl Inn, Germany. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 29, 1951 for the Archdiocese of Munich and Freising. For many years, he served as a professor of theology at Tübingen and Regensburg, and distinguished himself as a scholarly author. He was a peritus (appointed expert) at the Second Vatican Council. Ordained to the Episcopate on May 28, 1977, having been appointed archbishop of his home diocese, he was created Cardinal on June 27 of that same year. From 1982 to 2005, he served alongside St. John Paul II as Prefect of the then-Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. He was elected Pope on April 19, 2005, and served for almost eight years, becoming the first pope in almost 600 years to renounce the office, which he did on February 28, 2013. REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL: The visit of the Magi occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt. Matthew's Gospel tells a version of Jesus' birth that is different than the one in Luke. Of the actual birth of Jesus. Matthew tells us little more than, "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod . . . " The story of the census is found only in Luke's Gospel, but we hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew's Gospel. We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel does not say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. In Matthew's Gospel, they represent the Gentiles' search for a savior. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus. We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological. Gold is presented as representative of Jesus' kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple. Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death. The word Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana.

EPIPHANY BLESSING OF A HOME: The tradition of blessing the home each year on Epiphany dates from the Middle Ages. As a place where the Lord is revealed in



our relationships, the home is blessed in the following manner: a priest or parent uses blessed chalk to mark the inside of the front door with the initials "CMB", an abbreviation for the Latin blessing: *Christus mansionem benedicat*, which means, "May Christ bless this house." Throughout the year, those who come and go through the front door of your house will enjoy the blessing of Christ. These initials also represent the Magi named by tradition as Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. The initials are preceded by the first two dig-

its of the year and followed by the last two digits, with a small cross between the letters and the numbers: **20+C+M+B+23**.
